## Preparing for Your Presentation: Hot Tips

### Decisions to be made:

- √ Who will speak?
- √ How will you share speaking / presenting responsibilities amongst the group members?
- √ What visual aids (pictures, charts, slides) would help make your point?

### Once you have made these decisions, you need to:

- √ Write your presentation notes. Present your ideas clearly, and back up your recommendations with facts and examples.
- √ Rehearse your part of the presentation on your own: rehearsing in front of a friend or using a video camera can be very useful at this stage.
- √ Rehearse the presentation as a group: time yourselves – the object is to be thorough, but not lose your audience by being unfocussed and taking too long.

### On the day of the presentation:

- √ Make sure you know your material and have rehearsed your presentation.
- √ Make sure you have everything you need (visual aids, notes, etc.).
- √ Be prepared to answer questions about your recommendations.
- √ Be confident: you have done the research and you are the expert!
